### **New Features in Artix Connect 4.0**

The main new features in Artix Connect 4.0 are:

- Support for writing .NET servers that can be accessed using any of the transports and protocols supported by Artix.
- Support for using the Artix locator.
- Support for using the Artix session manager.
- Support for Artix security.
- An Add IDL Reference wizard that can be launched from within the Microsoft Visual Studio .NET 2003 development environment. The wizard enables a .NET developer to select the IDL file and IOR of a CORBA server and generate the required .NET metadata and client helper code. This makes writing a .NET client of a CORBA service easy.
- An idltowsdl command-line tool that a .NET developer can use to generate a WSDL file from a CORBA IDL file.
- New type support, including:
  - all XML Schema datatypes
  - anonymous sequence / all types
  - making callbacks into applications running outside the default AppDomain (that is, IIS)
  - passing references as in Args.

- attribute with in-line data description and with fixed value
- complex type derived from simple type
- porttype name that clashes with complex type name
- New demos for all new features.

### Known Issues in Artix Connect 4.0

The following are known issues in Artix Connect 4.0:

### Uninstaller does not Remove all Files

The uninstaller does not remove many of the files created under the installation directory. To uninstall these files you need to remove the install directory using Windows explorer. The installer does, however, remove the Artix Connect wizards from the global assembly cache and Windows registry, the custom remoting dll from the global assembly cache, and the wizard icons from the Visual Studio installation.

# Error Message When Building Locator Demo from Command Line

When building the locator demo from the command line, the following message appears if the locator has not been started:

Cannot create WsdlEndpointReference: WSDL exception: Fatal Error in XML Parser (id: , line: 0, column: 0, reason: An exception occurred! Type:NetAccessorException, Message:Could not connect to the socket for URL 'http://localhost:1393/get wsdl/WPb9cb/container.wsdl')

This message can safely be ignored.

### Visual Studio 2003 Restriction Affects Wizards

Due to a restriction in Visual Studio 2003, only one Visual Studio process should be running when the Add Artix Reference or Add CORBA Reference wizards are used.

## **Bugs Fixed in Artix Connect 4.0**

The following bugs have been fixed in Artix Connect 4.0:

Bug #	Description
ARTN-40007	Change order of dependencies in .sln file to avoid having to rebuild everything before running a demo.
ARTN-40012	Add registry key to ensure ArtixConnect.DLL assembly is available from inside Visual Studio .NET when right clicking on Assembly List.
ARTN-40028	The wsdltocs tool makes the first letter of a member name lowercase.
ARTN-40041	Problem with making callbacks into apps that do not run in the default app domain.
ARTN-40060	Wizard GUI always generates starting point code.
ARTN-40074	Support for "." in generated C# code in Visual Studio Wizard.
ARTN-40077	wsdltodotnet tool does not parse errors from wsdltocs correctly.
ARTN-40082	Start menu buttons should call artix_env
ARTN-40084	wsdltocs.exe tool generates log4j output.
ARTN-40087	Remove client.wsdl file from locator demo. It is confusing.
ARTN-40089	Add idltowsdl utility to kit - it wraps "idl -wsdl"
ARTN-40099	COMException raised when using Add IDL Reference wizard.
ARTN-40101	Wizard gui graphics misaligned.
ARTN-40102	wsdltodotnet -source switch generates type assembly DLL when there are multiple porttypes in a wsdl file.

#### Table 1: Bugs Fixed

Bug #	Description
ARTN-40105	GUI Wizard does not show all available services when multi-service WSDL is selected.
ARTN-40112	Debug/Start Without Debugging builds "standard" demos again.
ARTN-40118	Include JETVMPROP in artix_connect_env.
ARTN-40120	Add license installer start menu option
ARTN-40122	Include a new artix_connect_env.
ARTN-40125	All demo clients pause for user to press return before exiting.
ARTN-40136	Installation of MQ transport by default.
ARTN-40131	Installer not correctly registering elements when space in directory.
